- Underserved / Underrepresented Populations (LGBTQ+, Differently Abled Individuals, Asian/Pan-Asian, Middle Eastern, Immigrants-regardless of immigration status, Veterans, Etc.)
- Community Self-Definition & Self-Determination
- Broad Definition of Health (environmental, psychological, emotional, behavioral, social, economic, and spiritual health and well-being)

CON ALMA'S PRIORITIES

- Efforts that
 - Promote Systemic Change & Outcome Oriented (solutions focus)
 - Systems Focus vs. Direct Services (such as service provision to individuals—clinical or medical services, counseling, camps, food distribution, etc.)
 - Improve Health Conditions
 - Health & Racial Equity Focus
 - Strengthen or develop local community health infrastructures / institutions
 - Integrates 'health in all policies' framework
 - Build the capacities of community-based organizations to operate effectively, strengthen cross-sector collaborations, improve health care access, and solve problems (for example)
 - Engage community stakeholders in policy development, change efforts, collaborations, dialogues & problem solving (community informed/engaged)
 - Respect and respond to the values and experiences of all peoples and communities in New Mexico
 - Culturally & Linguistically (informed, reflective, relevant)

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity

- ▶ Background

- ▶ \$2.5 million grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation

- ▶ Timeline: over a 21-month period

- ▶ Phase 1: Vaccine Rollout

- ▶ 27 grants awarded total of \$600,000 for grant period of June 1 to Dec 31, 2021

- ▶ Phase 2: Community Rebuild Post Covid-19

- ▶ ***This*** grant opportunity

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity - Guidelines

▶ Key Dates

- ▶ Application Submission Period
- ▶ Grant Implementation Period
- ▶ Funds must be expended by

Sept 24 to Nov 1, 2021

Jan 1 to Dec 31, 2022

December 2022

▶ Reports:

- ▶ Progress (July 2022)*
- ▶ Final (January 2023)

▶ Disbursements:

- ▶ January 2022
- ▶ 2nd Disbursement: mid-to-late July 2022, contingent on Progress Report *

** Applies to grants of \$50k to \$100k*

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity – Guidelines

▶ Request Amounts

- ▶ Applicants may apply for up to \$100,000
- ▶ Requested amount should best fit applicant's capacity
 - ▶ Annual Organization (Operating) budget
 - ▶ Meets the proposed project needs
 - ▶ Expend fund within the 12-month implementation period

▶ Application Quiz & Questions

- ▶ Annual Organization budget < \$25,000 apply for up to \$30,000
- ▶ Annual Organization budget <= \$50,000 apply for up to \$55,000
- ▶ Annual Organization budget > \$50,000 apply for up to \$100,000

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity – Guidelines (Focus / Purpose)

Reimagine what NM communities can look like during differing stages of recovery and beyond, with a focus on '**building back better**' by addressing the disproportionate impact of Covid-19 on certain populations, communities and/or the non-profit sector in New Mexico.

Elements of successful applications:

- ▶ **community-centered** (driven/informed)
- ▶ **collaborative**
- ▶ **multi-sectoral**
- ▶ clearly demonstrate **health and racial equity approaches**
- ▶ focus on **systems-level solutions** that take up the lessons, experiences, promising innovations, and transformative opportunities from the pandemic to 'build back better.'

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity – Guidelines

Strong proposals...

- ▶ Address the disproportionate impact Covid-19 has had on certain populations ands/or the nonprofit sector in New Mexico.
- ▶ Expand health equity by:
 - ▶ Eliminating differences in quality, access, and underlying exposures which make some individuals, communities, and/or non-profits organizations more vulnerable than others.
 - ▶ Expanding opportunities for underserved populations and/or the nonprofit sector.
 - ▶ Addressing at least one of the social determinants of health (SDOH) such as those indicated by the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention's Healthy People 2030 or as identified by your community.

Social Determinants of Health aka Social Conditions

What are social determinants of health?

Social determinants of health (SDOH) are the conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.

SDOH can be grouped into 5 domains:

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity – Guidelines

Priority will be given to applications that:

- a. Address barriers and/or opportunities through **systems-level solutions** that take up the lessons, experiences, promising innovations, and transformative opportunities from the pandemic to 'build back better'.
- b. Involve coordination and alignment among and across sectors.
- c. Work within and/or across geographic areas.
- d. Demonstrate engagement of and are representative of beneficiaries 'as leaders' in the proposed work.
- e. Increase capacity of stakeholders to mobilize/leverage resources.

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity – Guidelines

Priority will be given to applications that:

- f. Prioritize underserved areas of and populations (or aspects within the nonprofit sector) that need additional support or increased capacity.
- g. Consider the complexity and challenges that are still unfolding related to Covid-19, including racial disparities, vaccine and health equity, fears of Covid-19 surges as pandemic fatigue, information overload, and the challenges experienced by people and/or non-profit organizations that are not fully recovered from the impacts of Covid-19.
- h. Integrate health equity and racial equity and a health in all policies (HiAP) framework in their efforts.
- i. Provide a clear relation between the request to be funded and Covid-19.
- j. Show association between proposed expenses/costs and the desired outcomes.

Community Rebuild Post-Covid 19 Grant Opportunity - Guidelines

- ▶ Required Information/Attachments (Tribal Letter, Organization Budget, etc.)
- ▶ Caps on Costs
- ▶ Eligibility (501c3 or via a Fiscal Sponsor)
 - ▶ Limitations & Restrictions
- ▶ Access Application through the grant portal available at www.conalma.org
- ▶ References (and links)
 - ▶ Health Equity
 - ▶ Health in All Policies
 - ▶ SDOH
 - ▶ Racial Equity
